• 2131 scrap tires are now on their way to be recycled.

• Earth Day Project under the direction of Diane Kinzer, Educational Coordinator at Hill City School, did a school wide project involving 2350 students, teaching the importance of being good stewards of our natural resources.

• Year to date the Adopt A Road Volunteers and Inmate Work Detail of the Pickens County Sheriff Department have picked up 928 bags from 73 miles of county roadways.

• City of Nelson disposed of 2 tons of trash and the City of Jasper held weekly cleanups during April.


Clean up and recycling does not stop with the end of the Great American Cleanup; it is an on going process.

Long Swamp ~ Marble Hill Mural



The mural located in front of the Huddle House on Highway 53 in Marble Hill was unveiled in a short ceremony. This mural is an interpretation of the early history of Marble Hill, named "Long Swamp" in early records, by a local artist Mary Ann Manzel (Rentz). The project took two years to complete. There is a plaque in front of the mural featuring descriptions of, the old Marble City School, Holcomb Post Office, located near the present day Foot Hills Shopping Center, Henry T. Fitzsimmons Family Cemetery, adjacent to Marble Hill Baptist Church. Piedmont Mill was on of the large mill operations maintained by The Georgia Marble Company. The Henry T. Fitzsimons and the stage coach on the Old Federal Road crossed from SE corner of Pickens to the NW corner.
