A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

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1	To amend an Act providing a homestead exemption from Pickens County School District ad valorem
2	taxes for educational purposes, (approved 4/21/97), from \$25,000 gross income, to \$40,000 net
3	income, for residents of that school district who are disabled or who are 65 years of age or older;
4 from	and to <u>exclude</u> Social Security benefits and retirement income; to change income requirements
5 <u>who</u>	all members of the family residing within the homestead to income of homeowner and spouse
6	<u>reside and occupy the homestead;</u> to provide for annual cost of living adjustments; to provide for
7 there	definitions; to specify the terms and conditions of the exemption and the procedures relating to;
8	to provide for applicability; to provide for a referendum, effective dates, and automatic repeal; to
9	repeal conflicting laws, and for other purposes.
10	BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA
11	SECTION 1.
12	(a) For purposes of the Act, the term
13	(1) "Ad valorem taxes for educational purposes" means all ad valorem taxes for
14	educational purposes levied by, for, or on behalf of the Pickens County School District,
15	including, but not limited to, taxes to pay interest on and to retire school bond
16	indebtedness.
17	(2) "Income" means Georgia taxable net income determined pursuant to Chapter 7 of Title 48 of the
18	O.G.C.A., as amended, for state income tax purposes, except income shall not include income
19	received as retirement, survivor, disability or social security benefits under the federal Social

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- 2 such income which is in excess of the maximum amount authorized to be paid to an individual and
- 3 such individual's spouse under the federal social security act. Income from such sources in excess of
 - 4 such maximum amount shall be included as income for the purposes of this Act.
 - 5 (3) "Homestead" means homestead as defined and qualified in Code Section 48-5-40 of
- 6 the O.C.G.A., as amended, with the additional qualification that it shall include not more than five
 - 7 contiguous acres of homestead property.
 - 8 (4) "Senior Citizen" means a person who is 65 years of age or over on or before January
 - 9 1 of the year in which application for the exemption under this Act is made.
- 10 (b) Each resident of the Pickens County School District who is disabled or who is a senior citizen is
- 11 granted an exemption on that person's homestead from all Pickens County School District ad
- 12 valorem taxes for educational purposes, in the amount of \$40,000 net income. The exemption under
- 13 this subsection shall only be granted if that person's net income, together with the net income of the
- spouse who also occupies and resides at such homestead, does not exceed \$40,000, excluding Social
- 15 Security income and retirement benefits, for the immediately preceding year.
- 16 (c) This Act shall provide for annual cost of living adjustments. For all taxable years beginning on or
- after ______, the amount of such homestead exemption shall be adjusted
- annually by the tax commissioner of Pickens County in a percentage amount equal to the most
- recently available federal Social Security Cost of Living Adjustment percentage.
- 20 (d) (1) In order to qualify for the exemption provided for in this section as being disabled, the person
- 21 claiming such exemption shall be required to obtain certificates from not more than three physicians
- 22 licensed to practice medicine under Chapter 34 of Title 43 of the O.C.G.A., as amended, certifying
- that in the opinion of such a physician or physicians, such person is mentally or physically
- incapacitated to the extend that such a person is unable to be gainfully employed and that such

25 incapacity is likely to be permanent. Such certificate or certificates shall constitute part of and be

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submitted with the application provided for in paragraph (2) of this subsection. A person can also

- 2 qualify for the exemption provided for in subsection (b) of this section as being disabled, by
- 3 presenting evidence that such a person has been found to be disabled by the Social Security
- 4 Administration or 100 percent disabled by the Veterans Administration.
- 5 (2) A person shall not receive the homestead exemption granted by subsection (b) and (d) of this
- 6 section unless the person or person's agent files an affidavit with the tax commissioner of
- 7 Pickens County giving the person's age, income, and/or such additional information relative to
- 8 receiving such exemption as will enable the tax commissioner of Pickens County to make a
- 9 determination as to whether such owner is entitled to such exemption.

10 SECTION 2.

- 11 The tax commissioner of Pickens County or the designee thereof shall provide application
- 12 forms for the exemption granted by this Act and shall require such information as may be
- 13 necessary to determine the initial and continuing eligibility of the owner for the exemption.

14 SECTION 3.

- 15 The exemption shall be claimed and returned as provided in Code Section 48-5-50.1 of the
- O.C.G.A., as amended. The exemption shall be automatically renewed from year to year as long as the
- person granted the homestead exemption under subsection (b) and (d) of Section 1 occupies the
- 18 residence as a homestead.
- After a person has filed the proper application as provided in subsection (b) and (d) of Section 1 of this
- 20 Act, it shall not be necessary to make application and file such affidavit thereafter for any year, and
- 21 the exemption shall continue to be allowed to such person. It shall be the duty of any person granted

22	the homestead exemption under this Act to notify the tax commissioner of Pickens County or the
23	designee thereof in the event that person for any reason becomes ineligible for that exemption.
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1	-3- SECTION 4.
2	The exemption granted by this Act shall not apply to or affect any state ad valorem taxes,
3	county or independent school district ad valorem taxes, or municipal ad
4 (d) of	valorem taxes for municipal purposes. The homestead exemption granted by subsection (b) and
5	Section 1 of this Act shall be in addition to, and not in lieu of, any other
6	homestead exemption applicable to Pickens County School District ad valorem taxes for
7	educational purposes.
8	SECTION 5.
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	The exemption granted by this Act shall apply to all taxable years beginning on or after
10	January 1,
11	SECTION 6.
12	Unless prohibited by the federal Voting Rights Act of 1962, as amended, the election
13	superintendent of Pickens County shall call and conduct an election as provided in this
14	section for the purpose of submitting this Act to the electors of the Pickens County School
15	District for approval or rejection. The election superintendent shall conduct that election on
16 that	the date of the state-wide general election in November, 2018, and shall issue the call and conduct
17	election as provided by general law. The superintendent shall cause the date and purpose of
18	the election to be published once a week for two weeks immediately preceding the date
19	thereof in the official organ of Pickens County. The ballot shall have written or printed
20	thereon the words:
21 from	"() YES Shall the Act be approved which revises the current homestead exemption

7	All persons desiring to vote for approval of the Act shall vote "Yes," and those persons
8	desiring to vote for rejection of the Act shall vote "No." If more than one-half of the votes
9	cast on such question are for approval of the Act, Sections 1 through 6 shall become of full
10	force and effect on January 1, If the Act is not approved or if the election is not
11	conducted as provided in this section, Sections 1 through 6 of the Act shall not become
12	effective and this Act shall be automatically repealed on the first day of January immediately
13	following that election date. The expense of such election shall be borne by Pickens County.
14	It shall be the election superintendent's duty to certify the result thereof to the Secretary of
15	State.
16	SECTION 7.
17	Except as otherwise provided in Section 6 of this Act, this Act shall become effective upon

its approval by the Governor or upon its becoming law without such approval.

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19 SECTION 8.

20 All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this Act are repealed.

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
